

Things to keep in mind

- Hospital volunteer programs generally run 6 months 1 year
- There are >40 undergraduate colleges in/around Boston so you're competing with a LOT of premeds, pre-nursing, nursing students
- Medical schools recommend around 100 hours
- Try to find something that interests you!
- Write about experiences that impact you

• MIT Emergency Medical Services (EMS) is another great option!

Why shadow?

Shadowing: What and When

- For you to experience what it's like to work as a doctor
- Try to see different departments
- Medical schools typically suggest around 50 hours

- Usually anywhere from 4 8 hours
- Week days
 - Classes > shadowing
